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Postcard from the Croatia:



Recently we had the opportunity to visit one of the worlds current travel hotspots. Croatia has again emerged as a favorite following civil unrest throughout the nineties. Our journey began with our arrival in Vienna, travelling south to Bled, in Slovenia, then onto Zagreb and Dubrovnik. Having been fortunate to travel throughout Europe, we found the rural landscape similar, with a strong Slovak influence, rich in cultural diversity, and heritage.



The country is still emerging from the soviet era, providing good value for the traveller.

Following our conference in Zagreb we flew to Dubrovnik, a World Heritage Listed walled city on the Adriatic Coast, said to be the most attractive and famous cities of the Mediterranean. We stayed at a fantastic location, Hotel Croatia, Cavtat, 5 Km south of Dubrovnik. Following a fantastic few days in this area we motored up the Adriatic Coast to Croatia's second largest City, Split. This drive afforded some spectacular scenery, hugging the coastline, with views across Croatia's 1185 islands. We also took the opportunity to detour into Bosnia to visit Mostar, a city of 50,000 showing much evidence of the more recent civil war; we visited the old city including the rebuilt Mostar Bridge. This experience of visiting a recent war zone was truly amazing.

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
